| East | <p>Art Nelson Guidance Center: Art Nelson – former guidance counselor</p> <p>Barrett Room (pit style classroom used for study halls): Hunk Barrett, former principal. A. J. (Hunk) Barrett had been at East since 1929 as a math teacher, football coach and vice principal. In 1957, Mr. Barrett became president of the Big 8 Conf.</p> <p>Bernie Kane Athletic Facility (Gym X & Y, currently the weight room): Bernie Kane, former athletic director, coach and technology teacher (1965-1996)</p> <p>Kelliher Field (practice field): Wayne (Knobby Kelliher, former physical education teacher and coach</p> <p>Louise H. Elser Room (currently used as a video surveillance room) Named for former staff member.</p> <p>Margaret Williams Theatre: former teacher. Taught Speech and coached drama. Upon her retirement, she donated all of her work to East High School and the Wisconsin Historical Society.</p> <p>Milton McPike Fieldhouse: Milt McPike, former principal of East from 1974-2004.</p> <p>Mueller Gymnasium: Herbert Mueller, former principal</p> <p>Pete Ross Faculty Lounge: Pete Ross, former social studies teacher and dept. chair</p> <p>Randle Room: (pit style classroom currently used for hall sweeps) Foster Randle, former principal. Foster was the first principal of East (1922-1954). During WWI he served as an officer in the US Army.</p> <p>Watt Room: (conference room) Dale Watt, former principal</p> |
| La Follette | <p>Arboretum: The arboretum was dedicated to Assistant Superintendent Kenneth Jensen, an enthusiastic supporter of the project. Money was donated in his memory.</p> <p>Bartlett Fieldhouse: The La Follette Fieldhouse was renovated thanks in part to a generous donation from Dr. William & Mrs. Phylis Barlett. Dr. Bartlett is a long time Madison physician who served as the La Follette team doctor for many years.</p> <p>Lussier Stadium: Lussier Stadium is a shared Football, Soccer and Track & Field facility for La Follette and East High School. Jack Lussier is a Madison resident who donated a significant amount of money for the construction of the stadium and the locker room facilities.</p> <p>Vander Meulen Auditorium: August Vander Meulen was the first principal of La Follette and served in that role from 1963-1974.</p> |

Also very prominent with UW hockey, US Olympic team and WIAA advisory</p> <p>Thomas E. Buchhauser Auditorium: Tom was a longtime Orchestra teacher at MJJ and very instrumental in the Madison music community</p> <p>John Olson Athletic Fields: John was a football coach, athletic director, Assistant Principal at JMM and was the MMSD Athletic director and Security and Safety Administrator</p> <p>Harold "Howdy" Olson JV Baseball Field: Howdy was the MMSD Building and Grounds Facility Manager for Mansfield Stadium and the creator of the JV Baseball Field on JMM grounds</p> <p>Arthur "Dynie" Mansfield Stadium: UW-Madison Baseball Coach, MMSD School Board member and long time supporter of education and athletics</p> |
