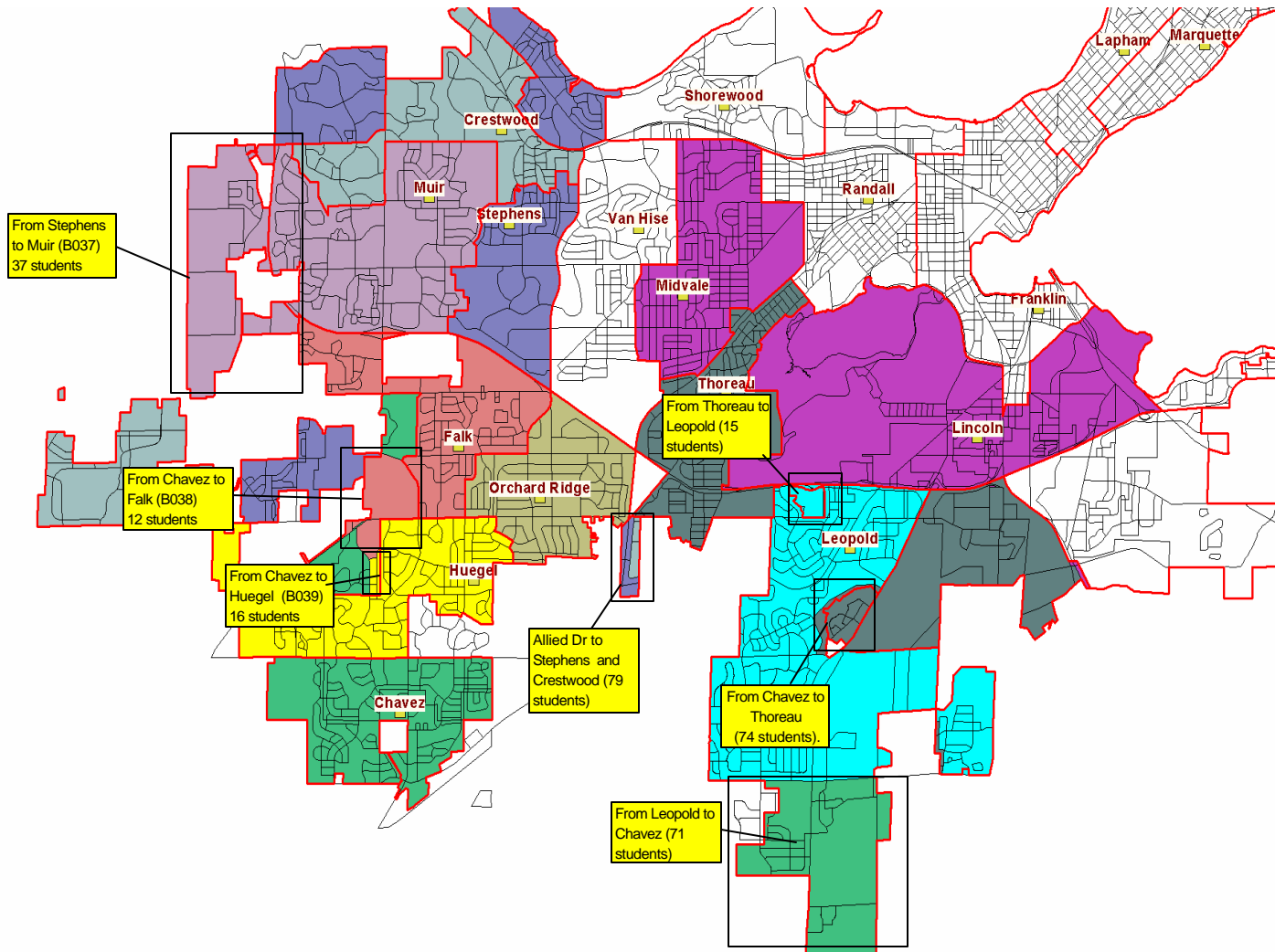

Approx 135 Early Childhood students reside in these areas.
 Approx 1180 K5 students in these areas are English Language Learners

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Considerations:

- 1. Every attempt will be made to keep bus routes no more than 45 minutes in duration one way.**
 - Bus routes are no more than 45 minutes in duration one way.

- 2. When redrawing boundary lines, current attendance area islands and optional areas will be reduced wherever possible and new ones will not be created.**
 - When redrawing boundary lines, current attendance area islands are reduced on Allied Drive by assigning students to only two schools.
 - Two islands are created from the former Leopold area.

- 3. No student will be required to change schools, as a result of boundary line changes, more than once during his/her elementary years.**
 - Students may be given the option to stay at their current school if they have moved once during the elementary years as a result of boundary line changes.

- 4. Grandfathering 4th and 5th grade students will be considered when boundary lines are redrawn and every effort will be made to allow 5th graders to remain at their school.**
 - 5th grade students may have an option to remain in their current school.

- 5. School size of two sections per grade level with maximum enrollment of 650 students.**
 - At least two sections are available in all schools.
 - No school has an enrollment that exceeds 650 students. Leopold enrollment is 626 students.

- 6. Every attempt will be made to avoid creating schools with high concentrations of low-income families.**
 - The low income percentage range stays the same: 18% to 65%

- 7. Efforts will be made to keep geographically and historically defined neighborhoods together and to consider the proximity of students to a school when redrawing boundary lines.**
 - Proximity of students from the neighborhood school was considered when redrawing boundary lines.
 - 304 students are reassigned.

1. Impact on Elementary Schools:

- From Thoreau to Leopold (15 students)
- From Chavez to Thoreau (74 students)
- From Leopold to Chavez (71 students)
- From Chavez to Huegel (16 students)
- From Chavez to Falk (12 students)
- From Stephens to Muir (37 students)
- Allied Drive to Stephens and Crestwood (79 students reassigned from Thoreau)
- Total number of students reassigned 304

2. Impact on Middle Schools:

Students who are reassigned will follow the normal feeder pattern to middle school for that new elementary school assignment.

3. Impact on High Schools:

Students who are reassigned will follow the normal feeder pattern to high school for that new elementary school assignment.

4. Budget Impact:

No budget impact.

5. Transportation Impact:

No transportation impact.

6. Future Development Impact:

- Swan Creek (50 students) –space available at Leopold
- Oak Meadow (40 students) – space will need to be identified.
- Heather Glen (30 students)-space available at Chavez without Oak Meadow
- Linden Park (43 students)-space available at Crestwood and Stephens
- Garfoot property (35 students) -space will need to be identified

7. Other Impact:

- The capacity percentage narrows from a current range of 58% - 104% to a new range of 58% - 97%.
