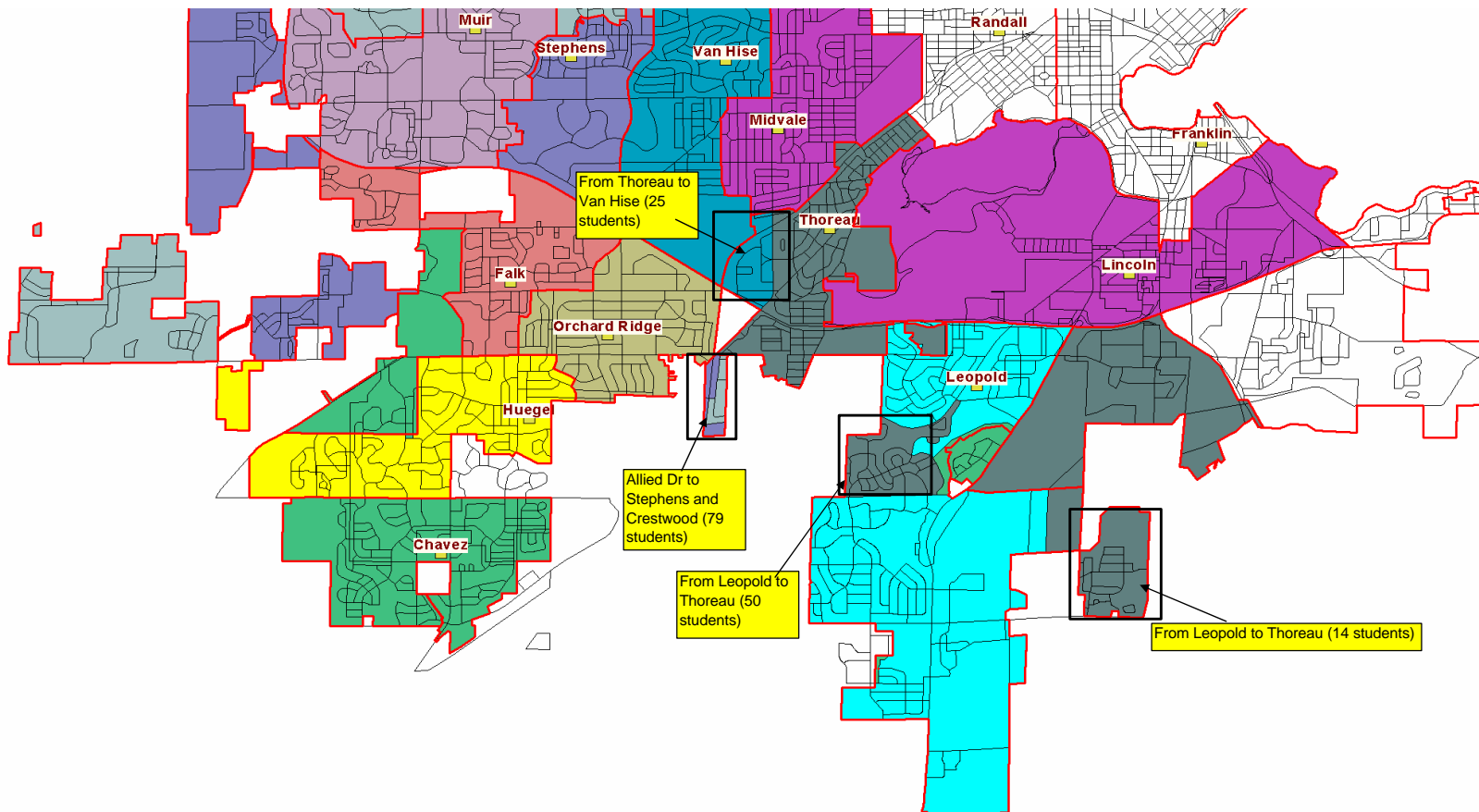

Considerations:

- 1. Every attempt will be made to keep bus routes no more than 45 minutes in duration one way.**
 - Bus routes are no more than 45 minutes in duration one way.

- 2. When redrawing boundary lines, current attendance area islands and optional areas will be reduced wherever possible and new ones will not be created.**
 - When redrawing boundary lines, current attendance area islands are reduced on Allied Drive by assigning students to two schools.
 - The current island east of Fish Hatchery Road that attends Thoreau would, in essence, be expanded. Areas added to this island include the a) the area bounded on the north by the CN & W rail corridor and on the south by McKee Road, and b) Swan Creek
 - Allied Drive is consolidated from the current four school assignment to two schools (i.e., Crestwood and Stephens).

- 3. No student will be required to change schools, as a result of boundary line changes, more than once during his/her elementary years.**
 - Students may be given the option to stay at their current school if they have moved once during the elementary years as a result of boundary line changes.

- 4. Grandfathering 4th and 5th grade students will be considered when boundary lines are redrawn and every effort will be made to allow 5th graders to remain at their school.**
 - 5th grade students have an option to remain in their current school.

- 5. School size of two sections per grade level with maximum enrollment of 650 students.**
 - At least two sections are available in all schools.
 - Beyond the paired school arrangements, the largest single K-5 school is Leopold with 618 students.

- 6. Every attempt will be made to avoid creating schools with high concentrations of low-income families.**
 - The low income percentage narrows from a current range of 18% - 65% to a new range of 20% - 65%.

- 7. Efforts will be made to keep geographically and historically defined neighborhoods together and to consider the proximity of students to a school when redrawing boundary lines.**
 - 168 students are reassigned.
 - Several areas currently within the Leopold area are reassigned to Thoreau.
 - The area currently attending Thoreau that is reassigned to Van Hise has historically been assigned to Thoreau.

1. Impact on Elementary Schools:

- From Allied Drive to Crestwood and Stephens (79 students)
- From Leopold to Thoreau (14 students – growth of 50 more students projected in this area)
- From Thoreau to Van Hise (25 students)
- From Leopold to Thoreau (50 students)
- Total students reassigned is 168

2. Impact on Middle Schools:

- Students who are reassigned will follow the normal feeder pattern to middle school for that new elementary school assignment.
- Cherokee Middle School experiences net loss of approximately 50 students, but should be offset by increasing enrollments from Fitchburg developments.
- Jefferson Middle School enrollment increases by an estimated 40 students due to Allied Drive reassignment.
- Minor increases in enrollment at Hamilton Middle School.
- All middle school enrollment adjustments can be accommodated within building capacities. This is true even for Hamilton Middle School if rooms are reallocated for use by Van Hise Elementary School.
- All Allied Drive students attend a single middle school, i.e., Jefferson Middle School.

3. Impact on High Schools:

- Students who are reassigned will follow the normal feeder pattern to high school for that new elementary school assignment.
- Memorial High School enrollment may increase by 60 students while West High School declines by that amount.
- All Allied Drive students attend a single high school, i.e., Memorial High School.
- High Ridge area continues assignment to Memorial High School.

5. Transportation Impact:

6. Future Development Impact:

- Thoreau capacity may exceed 100% if Swan Creek development increases by more than the projected 50 additional students.
- Leopold capacity can accommodate the projected 40 additional students from the Oak Meadow. However, additional students from the McGaw Park development may exceed capacity at Leopold. A specific estimate for students from the McGaw Park development is unknown at this time as it is not yet platted.
- Chavez can not accommodate the additional 30 students projected from the Heather Glen development near the Chavez School building location.
- Neither Crestwood nor Stephens can remain under 100% capacity as the Linden Park (43 students) and Garfoot (35 students) areas are developed. However, there may be other elementary schools within the Memorial attendance area that can accommodate these developments within their building capacity limits.

7. Other Impact:

- The capacity percentage narrows from a current range of 83% - 104% to a new range of 83% - 100%.
- Delays building new elementary school capacity, and possibly the location from Fitchburg to the western edge of the district boundary.
